abundant *adj.* (*uh-buhn-duhnt*): a large amount: more than enough.

❑ Community groups bought an **abundant** supply of snacks for the afterschool tutoring program.

belligerent *adj.* (*buh-lij-er-uhnt*): having an aggressive or fighting attitude; to be hostile or combative.

❑ Tammy became **belligerent** when the server messed up her order.

caboose *n.* (*kuh-boos*): the last car at the back of a train; someone or something that brings up the rear; buttocks.

❑ The tuba player is the **caboose** of the marching band’s line formation.

deceive *v.* (*dee-seev*): to trick or lead astray by cheating, being dishonest or creating a false impression.

❑ Credit card companies **deceive** college students with hidden fees, late charges and high interest rates.

eager *adj.* (*ee-ger*): impatient enthusiasm or desire; ready to make something happen.

❑ The kids were **eager** to take a field trip to the Mid-America science museum with their teacher.

famished *adj.* (*fam-isht*): intensely hungry.

❑ After three hours of practice, the football players were **famished**.

genuine *adj.* (*jen-yoo-in*): actual; true; produced by or proceeding from the original source; heart-felt, sincere or honest expressions of feelings.

 Rodney proposed to Erica with a ***genuine***, 3-carat pink diamond.

habitable *adj.* (*hab-i-tuh-buh l*): capable of being lived in; suitable to use as living quarters or housing.

 Camping tents for the homeless are not ideal, but ***habitable***.

ideal *n.* (*ahy-dee-uhl*): a standard or model of perfection, beauty or excellence; a goal; a favorable or preferred condition.

 Karen went on a diet to reach her ***ideal*** dress size before the wedding.

jovial *adj.* (*joe-vee-uhl*): having a good attitude; full of joy; friendly, fun or sociable.

 At school, Jeremy joined a group of ***jovial***, creative art students.
